

Good to be Green



Classroom rules should be clearly agreed and displayed so that expectations about behaviour are clearly understood by all.

- Respect for the right of others to learn is crucial and is the responsibility of each child to follow.
- If a child is making learning difficult for their peers the teacher should explain why that is a problem - **verbal warning**.
- If any further disruption is caused by that child the card is turned to **yellow** - **warning**.
- At this stage the warning is recorded in the Good to be **Green book as a record** - daily record kept by the teaching assistant.
- If there is another disruption the card goes **red** - **consequence** - to **miss 10 minutes of next playtime**.
- If there is further interruption the child is **moved within the class**.
- After that the child **will be sent to another classroom**.
- Parents should be encouraged to look at wall daily so that they can **follow up issues at home**.
- If there are several incidents in a week then the class teacher should **involve the parent directly**.
